On May 14th, 2020, Rebecca Solnit published a remarkable essay in The Guardian titled "The Way We Get through This is Together." Contemplating the first global wave of COVID 19, Solnit found hope in individual actions—creative, necessary, and generous—that "can tell other stories about who we are, what we want, and what is possible."

Reviewing the amazing range of submissions sent to the Visual Arts Alliance's 38th Juried Open, I was reminded of Solnit's words. The 131 artists from Texas and New Mexico who generously submitted 438 works for consideration told myriad stories, many deeply personal, some familiar to me, others new, and winnowing the selection in order to achieve a decisive statement was not an easy task. Ultimately 40 artists are represented by 50 works, chosen for their visual wit, their emotional engagement, and that almost ineffable quality of being able to capture and trigger one's imagination.

The great majority of these works were made during the pandemic years. However, no single theme emerges that would identify these as COVID-era works of art. Rather, perhaps, this juror's eye has been conditioned by the necessary pause that has affected all of our lives. I found I was drawn to works that expressed isolation—a desert plain, a lakeside cabin, or a worn-out toy—as well as images that celebrated family ties and the domestic sphere of everyday lives. Some artists arrested my attention by demonstrating their superb craftsmanship, others by disrupting traditional notions of finish with an anarchic humor. Moments of piercing beauty have stayed with me as well.

It has been a profound privilege to be a part of the splendid history of Houston's Visual Arts Alliance. And frankly, I cannot wait to experience this exhibition and meet these artists. I hope you will feel the same.
